

a Coruña and the world

GALICIA · SPAIN · EUROPE

A Coruña, situated on the north-west coast of Spain, is a major Atlantic commercial port. The city stands on a peninsula connected to the mainland by a narrow isthmus with two maritime fronts: on the one side the port, facing the coastal inlet of the Ría da Coruña, and on the other side the city's main beaches, Riazor and Orzán, bathed by the open sea.







History has shaped the city of A Coruña.

The Pre-Roman period

The Artabri tribe inhabited the area that today is known as the Ártabro Gulf. The remains of the Elviña castro or Iron Age fortified settlement are testimony to these Pre-Roman centres of population.

61 BCE

Julius Caesar disembarked in the 'Great Gulf of the Artabri', just outside the modern-day city of A Coruña in search of tin and gold. Forty years later, the legions of the Emperor Augustus would annex Gallaecia to the Roman Empire.

1st century CE

The Romans built the lighthouse known as 'the Tower of Hercules', a clear indication of the importance of maritime trade in the waters that bathed A Coruña.

1208

Alphonse IX, King of León, ordered the re-founding of the town, famed for its lighthouse, granting it a town charter, as well as a series of other rights and privileges. 'Crunia' was part of the quarter known today as the 'Old City', overlooking the port.

1446

King John II raised the status of the town to that of a city, and authorised free trade with England.

1520

King Charles I held court in the city and also set sail from its port to be crowned Holy Roman Emperor in Germany.

1522

The Spice Exchange was founded in A Coruña, bringing prosperity to the city, but also converting it into target for pirates and enemies of the Crown.

1587

Work began on the construction of the San Antón fortress under the orders of King Charles I.

1589

English troops, led by the privateer Francis Drake, were ordered to attack and lay siege to A Coruña by Elizabeth I, Queen of England. Local heroine María Pita headed the defence of the city.

1778

King Charles III authorised the start of trading operations between the port of A Coruña and America.

1788

Eustaquio Giannini commenced the major renovation of the Tower of Hercules. The project preserved the monument's Roman remains and provided an exhibition space for them.

1809

The British general Sir John Moore was mortally wounded in the Battle of Elviña, which took place on the outskirts of A Coruña and was one of the principal and bloodiest confrontations fought in Galicia during the Peninsular War.

19th century

A growing population led to changes in the city's appearance, as well as improvements to its thoroughfares. Public buildings were constructed in the Pescadería district. originally a fishing quarter. and the tobacco factory began production in the area known as A Palloza. In 1857, the factory's female workers, known as cigarreras, demonstrated on the factory roofs, demanding better rights. It was during this period that the foundations were laid for the modern city.

20th century

New industries and overseas trade allowed for the expansion of the city and the building of luxurious homes in the Modernist and eclectic styles. Industrial growth would also lead to the consolidation of a strong trade union movement in the city.

1936

Local resident Santiago Casares Quiroga was appointed President of the Council of Ministers. During his term as President, he held the referendum on Galicia's Statute of Autonomy.

1986

Work began on Europe's largest urban sea promenade.

On 27th June 2009 the Tower of Hercules, the only working Roman lighthouse, was included on the World Heritage List. The UNESCO committee made particular reference to the outstanding 18th century restoration work.

Nowadays

Modern-day A Coruña is an open, outgoing and dynamic city. It boasts a major port, making it an attractive destination, as well as a city of commerce and trade and is firmly positioned at the forefront of the latest trends in Atlantic gastronomy. It is a major reference in the worlds of fashion and culture both here and throughout the world.

As you stroll around the city you will come across characters who will offer a series of clues as to who we are and our nature, providing you with a fascinating insight into our true history.

Caio Sevio Lupo

A native of Coimbra

The Tower of Hercules is the only Roman lighthouse that can be attributed to a named architect. It was the architect himself who took pains to ensure that he would be remembered, carving his name on a votive inscription dedicated to the god Mars Ultor that can be seen at the base of the tower.

Eustaquio Giannini

Badajoz, 1750 - 1814

A military enginee

A military engineer who, in the late 18th century, was commissioned with the most radical alteration work to be carried out on the tower. Giannini also left his mark in stone as the author of the restoration work that would convert the tower into a modern lighthouse in keeping with the latest advances of the day.



María Pita

Sigrás. 1565 - 1643

In 1589, the troops led by the corsair Francis Drake attacked the city on the orders of Queen Elizabeth Lof England, María Pita's husband died during the struggle. Filled with rage. she seized the English flag from a lance, killing Francis Drake's brother as she cried out in Galician "Quen teña honra que me siga" ("Let all men and women of honour follow me"). María Pita and the city's 4,000 inhabitants put up a successful fight against the 12,000 strong English army.

María Pita House Museum (1) Ferrerías, 28, Old Town An exhibition space dedicated to A Coruña's most famous heroine.

Sir John Moore

Glasgow, 1761 - A Coruña, 1809

A British general who led the retreat of the English troops from the Port of A Coruña during the Peninsula War. He was mortally wounded at the Battle of Elviña.

Eusebio da Guarda

A Coruña. 1825 - París. 1897

Eusebio da Guarda, married to the widow of a shipowner, will always be remembered for his love of the city. Examples of his philanthropy include the secondary school that bears his name, the former marketplace in the Plaza de Lugo and the reconstruction of the Chapel of San Andrés.

Rosalía de Castro

Santiago, 1837 - Padrón, 1885

This poet and novelist is considered to be the most important female Galician writer of all time. She lived in the Old Town with her husband, Manuel Murguía, who was also a writer.


Emilia Pardo Bazán

A Coruña. 1851 - Madrid. 1921

A countess, writer and feminist with a particular devotion for the city of A Coruña. A staunch defender of women's rights and education. In her novel La Tribuna ('The Tribune of the People'), she coined the term by which the city is popularly known - 'Marineda'.

Emilia Pardo Bazán House Museum (2)

Tabernas, 11-1º, Old Town The writer's family home and headquarters of Royal Academy of the Galician Language.



Picadillo

Santiago, 1874 - A Coruña, 1918

The city's tapas competition, which takes place each September, is named after Don Manuel María Puga y Parga, 'Picadillo', mayor of the city in 1915 and 1917. A famous gourmet, he wrote highly entertaining recipe books featuring classic Galician dishes in a defence of traditional cooking at a time when high society showed a clear preference for French-style cuisine.

Pablo Picasso

Málaga, 1881 - Mougins, 1973

He spent his childhood in A Coruña. He came to the city as a child but left as an artist. His father was an art teacher at the school which today is known as the Eusebio Daguarda Secondary School.

Picasso House Museum (3) Paio Gómez, 14 Tour the house where Picasso lived as a young boy.



Casares Quiroga

A Coruña, 1884 - París, 1950

A lawyer, politician, advocate of Galician nationalism and President of the Government during the Second Republic, from May to July 1936. Whilst in office, the referendum on the Galician Statute of Autonomy was held.

Wenceslao Fernández Flórez

A Coruña, 1885 - Madrid, 1964

This writer and journalist, born on Torreiro Street, is widely held to be one of the greatest Spanish literary humourists of the 20th century. Many of his works have been made into films, including El Bosque Animado ('The Enchanted Wood').



Luis Seoane

Buenos Aires, 1910 A Coruña. 1979

An artist, writer and intellectual who, in the 1970s, revolutionised Galician art and history with his designs for El Castro and Sargadelos ceramic factories. Seoane is attributed with the phrase: "The Galicians will eventually learn about their history, even though it is limited to bric-a-brac and other knick-knacks..."

Elisa and Marcela

A Coruña in 1900

Two female teachers, Elisa and Marcela, were married in A Coruña's Church of San Jorge in 1901. To carry off their ploy, Elisa took on the personality of Mario, a male cousin who had passed away. The story was published in newspapers throughout Spain, and the couple decided to flee across the Atlantic. This tale of love and courage is the plot of a film directed by Isabel Coixet.

The Tower of Hercules, built by the Romans in the 1st century CE, is the world's oldest working lighthouse. In 2009 it was included on the UNESCO World Heritage List. The Tower is surrounded by an open-air museum.

A MARIÑA GALLERY WINDOWS-PORT

A Coruña is famous for its glass-fronted buildings. The Marina, overlooking the sea, boasts the finest examples of this architectural feature. The arcades are lined with restaurants and coffee shops that are the ideal spot for watching all kinds of ships and boats as they dock in the port.



SAN PEDRO MOUNT

Taking a trip up to this park and viewpoint offers visitors the chance to contemplate the city from the air and discover the unique relief of our coastline thanks to the 360° panoramic views of the Ártabro Gulf and Death Coast (Costa da Morte). (POINT 8 OUTSIDE AERIAL PHOTO)



SEA PROMENADE - BEACHES

Find your favourite spot on any of the city's five beaches. Two kilometers of sands, a fabulous sea promenade and all the essence of the Atlantic. Take advantage of the opportunity to try your hand at a wide range of water sports such as surfing and sailing.



SAN ANTÓN CASTLE

This 16th century castle has been a fortress, prison and even an isolation hospital. Today it houses A Coruña's Archaeology and History Museum.



MODERNIST A CORUÑA

A stroll around the busy city centre shopping streets reveals the city as it was during the late 19th and early 20th centuries. Streets lined with opulent façades in a mix of restrained eclectic styles and the legacy of modernity inherited from Europe's Art Nouveau movement.



The **Old Town** is a must-see tour offering a fascinating insight into the history of A Coruña. Its street names, churches and noble houses will reveal all the secrets of our medieval and Baroque past.

Enjoy this stroll along the cobbled streets that form the oldest part of the city, which was refounded in 1208 on the orders of Alphonse IX of León and nestles on the shores of the stormy North Atlantic, the site of the former Roman settlement of Crunia.

Together with the Tower of Hercules, **the galleries** that line the waterfront area overlooking the port are undoubtedly our best-known landmarks.

The houses with their traditional galleries that can be seen on A Mariña and Montoto avenues make A Coruña a truly unique city. The street cafés and the large esplanade that looks out to sea form a focal point for cosmopolitan living, enhanced by the arrival of the cruise ships that moor in the heart of the city.

Every year almost 200,000 people disembark in A Coruña, guide by the shining light of the Tower of Hercules.



A Coruña is Atlantic, sea and salt.

Find your spot on any of the **5 beaches** to relax and unwind, enjoy a swim or try your hand at water sports such as surfing or sailing.

Explore the **Sea Promenade**, the longest in Europe stretching out for more than 13 km, and enjoy the views and all the attractions the city has to offer: the port, monuments, lighthouse and beaches... all dotted along a promenade imbued with the authentic essence of the Atlantic.





The museum houses a collection that includes objects made of precious metals, as well as exhibits from the protohistoric and megalithic periods, the Bronze Age and castro culture, the Roman Empire and covering various aspects of the city.





San Antón Castle is located in an attractive setting at the entrance to the city harbour. Built in the 16th century, it was originally a fortress, although in addition to defending the city, it has also housed a prison and a lazarette. Since 1968 it has been the Archaeology and History Museum and in 1994 it was declared a Historic and Artistic Monument.

The museum boasts many exhibits of immense value, dating from the origins of civilisation in Galicia right up until the contemporary history of the city and province. A tour of this museum is like venturing back in time as you stroll around the various areas of this former fortress.



This is our tower, our landmark. Its silhouette mirrored on the ocean reflects the Atlantic character of the people of A Coruña. The **Tower of Hercules** is part of our heritage and, since 2009, a World Heritage Site.

A truly unique monument, and also the world's oldest working lighthouse. Built by the Romans in the 1st century CE, the original construction was lower, wider and featured an exterior ramp used to take the wood that fuelled the fire up to the top of the tower.

In 1788, Eustaquio Giannini, aided by city alderman José Cornide, embarked on an ambitious plan to renovate the tower. This is the Tower that stands out against the magnificent early evening skies of A Coruña.

This **museum-park**, nestling in the Ártabro Gulf, covers the entire peninsula where the Tower of Hercules stands, and includes the areas known as Punta Herminia, O Acoroado and Cabal de Pradeira. The sculptures have been cleverly arranged to establish an ongoing dialogue with the lighthouse. It is an area dotted with cliffs, islets, and sea caves, known locally as furnas, as well as small beaches.

The Atlantic and its winds, characterised by blustery and salty squalls, shape the landscape and determine the park's flora and fauna. Conditions here are harsh, and only the strongest, most unique and special species will survive. After all, what doesn't kill you makes you stronger.

Housed in a small palazzo situated in Santa Margarita Park, the facilities include a planetarium and three floors of exhibition space. understanding of the world they live in.


Monte de San Pedro juts out into the Atlantic, affording the city's most breathtaking panoramic views. A strategic point from which to defend and watch over the city, evidenced by the two large guns that can be seen here. On the opposite side of the bay of A Coruña, the Tower of Hercules salutes them each morning, marking the boundaries of the Orzán inlet.

Nature, the strength of the winds and the immensity of the sea are the three elements that accompany every visit to Monte de San Pedro. Make sure you take the time to visit and marvel at the truly magnificent views.

Take a trip back to the early 20th century as you tour the districts known as Ensanche and Pescadería. Streets lined with the elaborate façades decorated in the two fashions of the day: the more sober eclectic style and the modernity passed on by the Art Nouveau school that arrived from Europe. Review of Picasso's first exhibition. La Voz de Galicia (21-2-1895)

In the 19th century the city provided a home and care for a child named Pablo Ruiz. A young yet immensely talented boy who years later would revolutionise the parameters of contemporary art. The Ruiz Picasso family home in the heart of the city can still be visited today. The patriarch, a teacher at the School of Arts and Crafts, instilled his love of painting in his family.

And so it was that the young Picasso began to express his feelings and sentiments through sketches and paintings. The beach, the bullring, the Tower of Hercules, the marina, his friends and even the beggars on the street...all perfect excuses to give full rein to his talent on any surface.


His younger sister Conchita died of diphtheria the very year that the family decided to leave the city. Part of this great artist would remain in the city for ever. The city he grew up in, where he played and painted, is the same that today provides endless inspiration for those that stroll around its streets.


Tradition has it that the Apostle Saint James the Greater preached in the far west of the region that is today known as Galicia, and which in the 1st century CE was considered by the Romans to be the end of the world. In the 9th century a site was discovered containing what was believed to be the Apostle's tomb.

This discovery led to a surprisingly large movement of pilgrims from all over Europe throughout the Middle Ages, which resulted in the founding of the city of Santiago de Compostela and its cathedral. Many of these pilgrims travelled by sea, making the voyage from all the European countries that lined the Atlantic seaboard such as Poland, Sweden and many others.

Practically all these seafaring pilgrims sailed to the city of A Coruña, which had been founded in 1208. This was due to its proximity to Santiago, a mere 75 km away, and the wealth of services available in the port.

The English formed the largest group of pilgrims, and so this route became known as The English Way. In the 1990s it was restored as a pilgrim trail. Santiago Cathedral grants the Compostela, the official pilgrimage certificate, to all those that complete the Way from A Coruña under certain conditions.

Just outside the city, visitors will find a number of delightful sites to visit in the area known by the name **As Mariñas Coruñesas** and bathed by the waters of the **Ártabro Gulf**.

The options include a route along the east coast of the Ría da Coruña, in Oleiros, which affords spectacular views of the city, the port and the **Tower of Hercules**.

Alternatively, explore the medieval cities of Betanzos and Pontedeume, once home to the Knight Fernán Pérez de Andrade O Boo ('the Good'). The sights and monuments in towns such as Sada, Bergondo, Abegondo, Cambre, Carral or Culleredo are also well worth exploring.

Visitors should also take the time to marvel at the rough seas that bathe the beaches of Arteixo, stretching out as far as the fishing town of Caión, the gateway to the much-feared Costa da Morte or 'Death Coast'.





The beaches are filled with bonfires and A Coruña's most authentic districts provide the backdrop for literally thousands of mini-celebrations, all accompanied by music, fun and laughter, char-grilled sardines, broa corn bread and lots more besides. Follow the smell of the hot coals and you are bound to discover places to enjoy delicious food and great company. At midnight, make your way down to the beach to watch the burning of the falla - a tonque-in-cheek sculpture made of wood and papier-mâché - and marvel at the firework display.




